From the start Earl was able to let the Council know that our financial reports were inefficient and vastly incorrect for our immediate needs. Earl set up proper accounting records and accountability reports and we very quickly changed management firms as we were not getting truthful reports. Over the years Earl proved to being as valuable asset to our Council and neighbourhood and often you would find Earl, Al Saunders and myself doing inspection reports at all hours and making the Complex run smoothly, safely, and honestly.
