To many, Jack Alexander was known as 'quite the character.' Blessed with a quick wit, he was always ready with a joke, regularly delivered with a wink and a smile. However, to all those who truly knew him, he was also a generous, thoughtful and creative soul. Jack was born in Winnipeg and grew up in Ontario. He joined the RCAF at the age of 18, but missed his chance to serve in WWII. He filled his life with the things he loved: dancing (to his impressive record collection), fishing, traveling, playing cards and was especially proud of the home he built himself in Coral Beach. Along the way Jack became a top salesman for National Cash Register, with his integrity recognized by clients across BC.
