Lincoln James Penner was born in Winnipeg September 30, 1954. At a very young age he came to bless the home of William and Adina Penner. He passed away May 30, 2018 in Vancouver after a time of multiple health issues which led to cardiac arrest. He reached the age of 63 years. Lincoln grew up on a farm at Ste. Anne, MB. He received his education at the Greenland North School and the Landmark Collegiate. As a teenager he gave his heart to God and was baptized November 29, 1970 into the Church of God in Christ, Mennonite. In May of 1982 he married Lynne Cawker McPhee. He also spent a few years in the hospitality business. In 2013 he successfully completed an Automotive Service Technician course. Due to his declining health he retired in 2017. He loved to help unfortunate people and until very recently was actively involved in volunteering at the food bank and various outreach programs.
